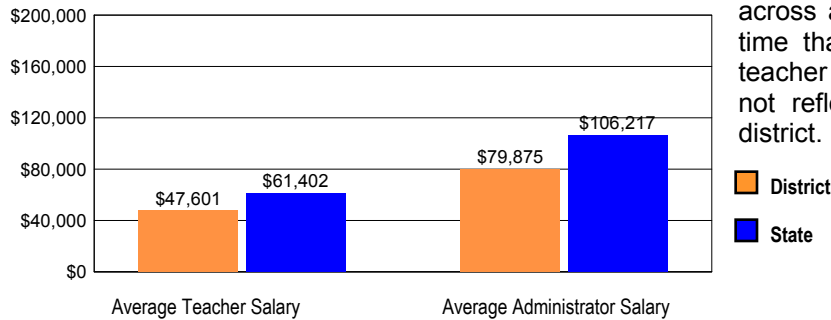

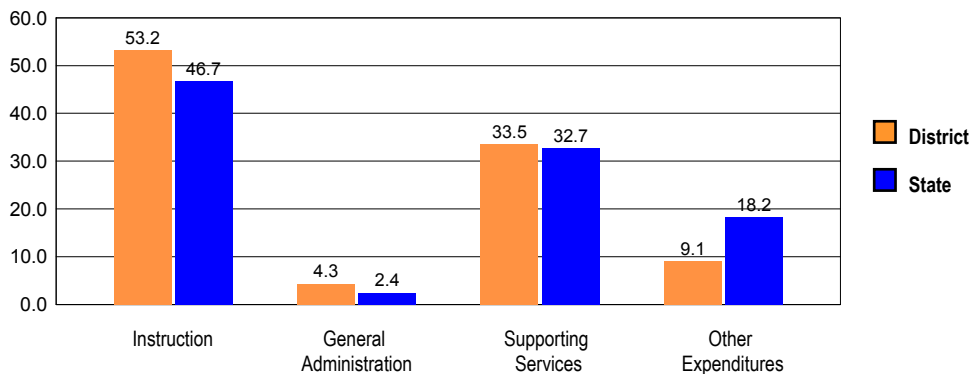
SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCES

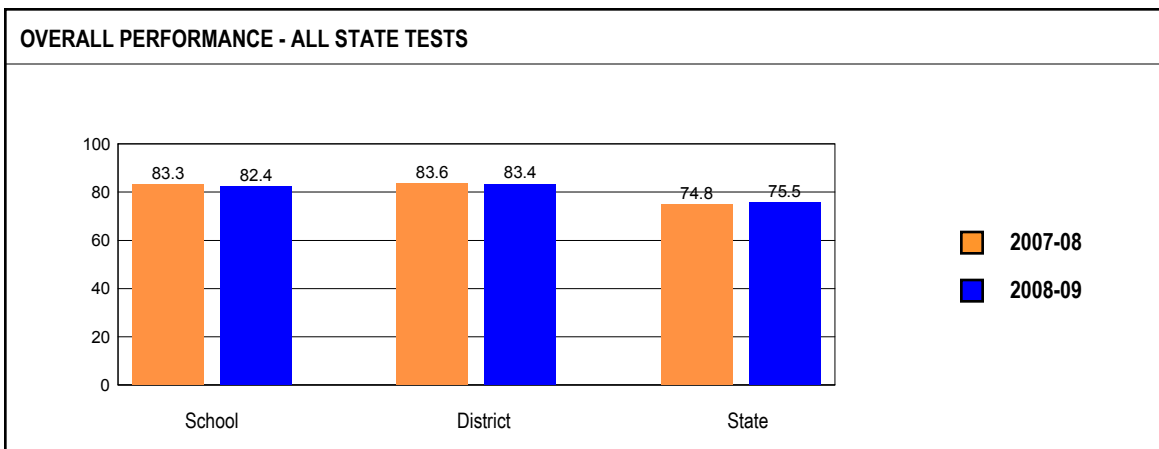

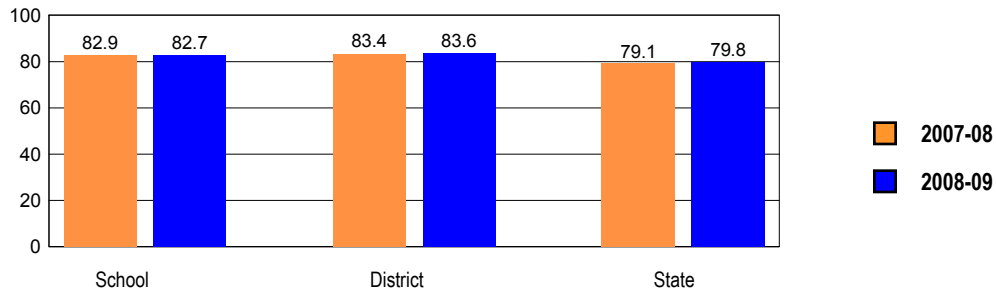
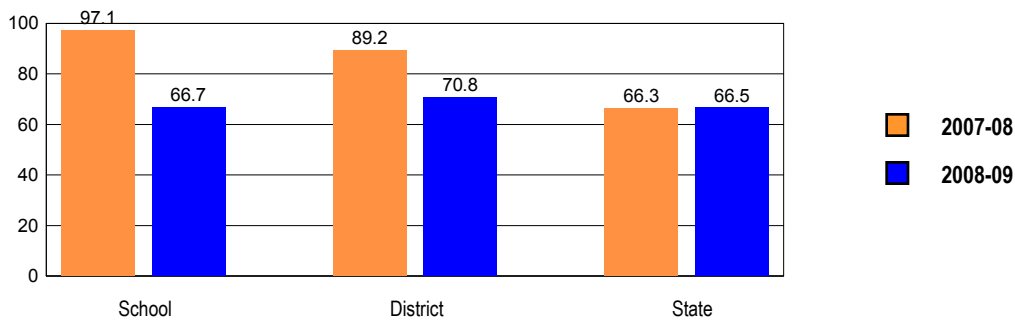
ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

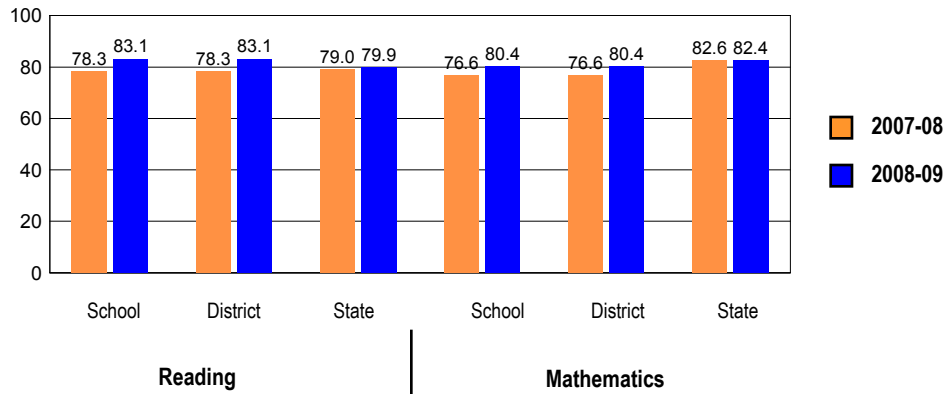

IAA scores in the Progressing and Attaining performance levels count the same, respectfully, as scores on other state assessments that meet or exceed Standards.

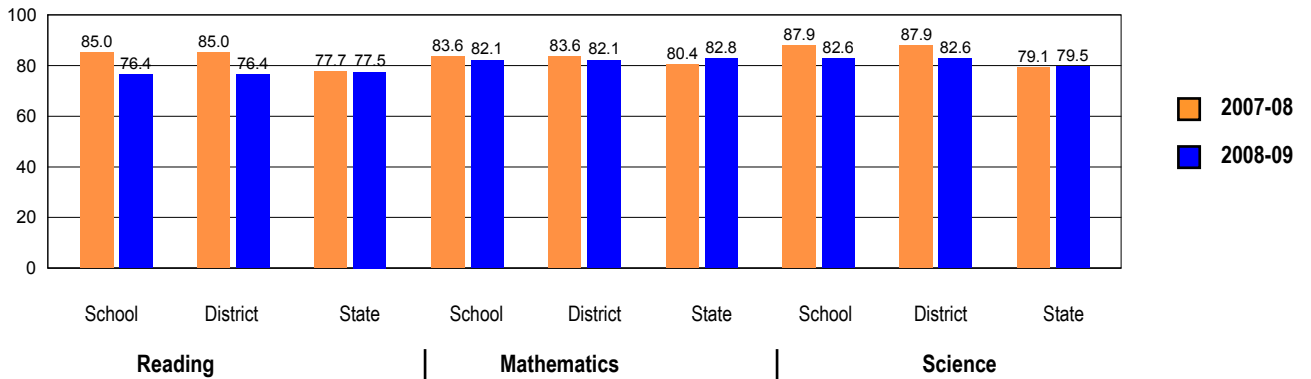

These charts provide information on attainment of the Illinois Learning Standards. They show the percents of student scores meeting or exceeding Standards for the grades and subjects tested on ISAT.

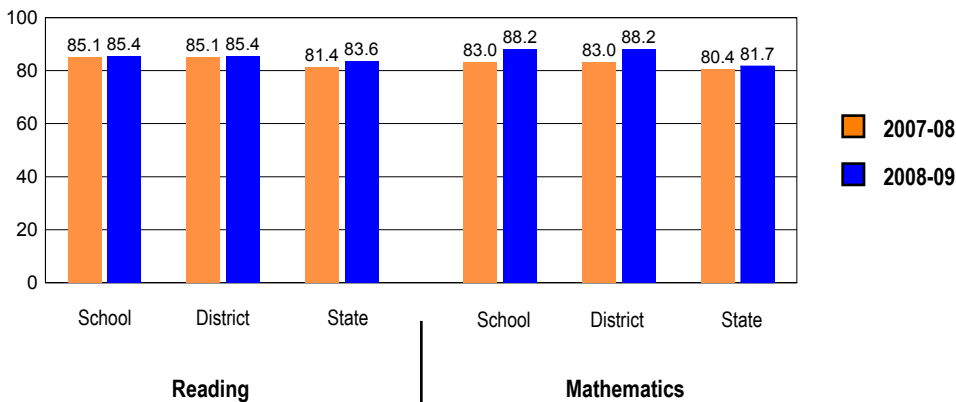
ISAT Grade 6

PERFORMANCE ON STATE ASSESSMENTS

Federal law requires that student achievement results for reading, mathematics, and science for schools providing Title I services be reported to the general public.

The Illinois Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) is administered to students in grades 3 through 8. The Prairie State Achievement Examination (PSAE) is administered to students in grade 11. The Illinois Alternate Assessment (IAA) is administered to students with disabilities whose Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) indicate that participation in the ISAT or PSAE would not be appropriate.

Students with disabilities have an IEP (No Child Left Behind Act). An IEP is a written plan for a child with a disability who is eligible to receive special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

Reading and Mathematics are tested in grades 3 through 8 and 11. Science is tested in grades 4, 7, and 11.

In order to protect students' identities, test data for groups of fewer than ten students are not reported.

ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT)

The following tables show the percentages of student scores in each of four performance levels. These levels were established with the help of Illinois educators who teach the grade levels and learning areas tested. Due to rounding, the sum of the percentages in the four performance levels may not always equal 100.

Level 1 -- Academic Warning - Student work demonstrates limited knowledge and skills in the subject. Because of major gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills ineffectively.

Level 2 -- Below Standards - Student work demonstrates basic knowledge and skills in the subject. However, because of gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills in limited ways.

Level 3 -- Meets Standards - Student work demonstrates proficient knowledge and skills in the subject. Students effectively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems.

Level 4 -- Exceeds Standards - Student work demonstrates advanced knowledge and skills in the subject. Students creatively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems and evaluate the results.

1. At least 95% tested in reading and mathematics for every student group. If the current year participation rate is less than 95%, this condition may be met if the average of the current and preceding year rates is at least 95%, or if the average of the current and two preceding years is at least 95%. Only actual participation rates are printed. If the participation rate printed is less than 95% and yet this school makes AYP, it means that the 95% condition was met by averaging.
2. At least 70.0% meeting/exceeding standards in reading and mathematics for every group. For any group with less than 70.0% meeting/exceeding standards, a 95% confidence interval was applied. Subgroups may meet this condition through Safe Harbor provisions. ***
3. For schools not making AYP solely because the IEP group fails to have 70.0% meeting/exceeding standards, 14% may be added to this variable in accordance with the federal 2% flexibility provision.

In order for Safe Harbor to apply, a subgroup must decrease by 10% the percentage of scores that did not meet state standards from the previous year plus meet the other indicators (attendance rate for non-high schools and graduation rate for high schools) for the subgroup. For subgroups that do not meet their Safe Harbor Targets, a 75% confidence interval is applied. Safe Harbor allows schools an alternate method to meet subgroup minimum targets on achievement.

- Continue SRA reading program. Instructional students in a pull out program at each level. Title I students will receive reading instruction in a co-teaching environment with the Title I and content area Reading teacher.
- Complete comprehension activities of various types for reading materials at each grade level using graphic organizers and other various research based strategies.
- Continue reading portfolios for all special education students.
- Continued identification of Title I and collaborative students who did not meet state standards on ISAT and those with low RIT scores on MAP for the purpose of providing additional support.
- Continue to provide and support additional reading instruction to Tier II students using RtI guidelines and broaden the spectrum for students requiring Tier III interventions in reading.

Target #2: Improve student understanding and application of the Illinois Learning Standards for mathematics, including all identified subgroups, as measured by state and local testing. Improved performance in student Math levels on ISAT 3-5% in grades 6-8

- Continue to provide and support additional mathematics instruction to Tier II students using MAP, ISAT and local data to identify students needing interventions
- 6th grade will do projects and activities that support Geometry units to increase academic performance in ISAT areas that students consistently show indicators for improvement.
- The 7th grade will use daily journals to develop and improve mathematical vocabulary and communication skills necessary for academic improvement and growth.
- The 7th grade will use Geometer's Sketchpad to investigate various geometric concepts and develop problem solving skills at the application and analysis level.
- The 8th grade will work with the high school on articulation and development of Algebra curriculum to improve student math skills.

Target #3: Continue current focus on writing across all content areas, which have been aligned to state learning standards.

- Focus on activities that support the three areas of ISAT writing (Narrative, Expository, and Persuasive).
- Support the writing process by integrating writing within the 4 core content areas (Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies) and Exploratory (Music, Art, Computers, and Tech Lab).
- Implement writing strategy sessions in the area of Language Arts.
- Incorporate a variety of writing forms for a specified purpose and audience.
- Continue usage of the Vantage Learning "Go My Access" online writing program.
- Conduct ISAT Extended Response problems weekly to improve student writing on ISAT.
- The 7th grade will use daily journals to develop and improve mathematical vocabulary and communication skills necessary for academic improvement and growth. Additionally, Social Studies will use daily Journals

Target #4: Continue developing school culture at CJHS that is founded on commonly accepted core values in the area of responsibility, communication, character education, social skills.

- Improve basic understanding of social skills and character education. Emphasize the importance of student responsibilities (work completion, promptness)
- Continual improvement of the communication process
- Continue to teach character education, student responsibilities, and respect in collaboration with the Tazewell County Health Department.
- All teachers will continue to promote positive behavior and conduct through each team developing an activity that supports positive decision making and behavior.
